Now when the king was settled in his house, and the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, "See now, I am living

in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent." Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that you have in mind; for the Lord is with you."

But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the Lord: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" Now therefore thus you shall say to my servant David: Thus says the Lord of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel; and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house. Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me; your throne shall be established forever.




The Presider continues

As our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray:



Following the announcement last week concerning the reintroduction of singing in churches, St Luke's has had to complete another COVID-19 Safety Plan as required by the NSW Government. In order for us to comply with directions and for us all to be able to enjoy the lifting of restrictions, please note:

- If you are feeling unwell, please don't attend services or the Parish Office.
- Everyone attending the Church or Parish Office must, on arrival, have their temperature checked, hand sanitise and provide contact tracing details (if not already provided).
- <u>Please preregister if you plan to attend a service</u>. An Eventbrite link is emailed each week or you can contact Helen in the Parish Office on 9969 6910 or by email: office@stlukesmosman.org
- You are strongly encouraged to wear a face mask at all times on the Parish site. It is ESSENTIAL to wear a mask if you wish to sing. Otherwise, you must not join in any singing during the service.
- You must avoid crowding together and maintain physical distancing of at least 1.5 metres. During communion, please observe directions from those assisting.
- In Church, please only sit on the designated "green square" areas on the pews or on the soft padded seats at the front.
- <u>Please disperse quickly at the end of all services</u>. The NSW Government recommendations specifically advise against congregating socially at the conclusion of services.
