#### The Second Reading A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Hebrews

The central fact of existence is that this trust in God, this faith, is the firm foundation under everything that makes life worth living. It's our handle on what we can't see. The act of faith is what distinguished our ancestors, set them above the crowd.

By faith, Abraham said yes to God's call to travel to an unknown place that would become his home. When he left he had no idea where he was going. By faith he lived in the country promised him, lived as a stranger camping in tents. Isaac and Jacob did the same, living under the same promise. Abraham did it by keeping his eye on an unseen city with real, eternal foundations - the City designed and built by God.

By faith, barren Sarah was able to become pregnant, old woman as she was at the time, because she believed the One who made a promise would do what he said. That's how it happened that from one old man's body there

are now people numbering into the millions – as many as the stars in the sky and the sands on the seashore.

Each one of these people of faith died, not yet having in hand what was promised, but still believing. How did they do it? They saw it way off in the distance, waved their greeting, and accepted the fact that they were strangers in this world. People who live this way make it plain that they are looking for their true home. If they were homesick for the old country, they could have gone back any time they wanted. But they were after a far better country than that - heaven country. You can see why God is so proud of them, and has a City waiting for them.

#### The Sermon - The Rector

#### The Creed

Let us join together in the words of the Nicene Creed.



Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:








\*Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'


