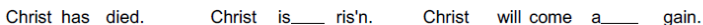
Merciful God, we thank you

 ✠Do this in remembrance of me.'

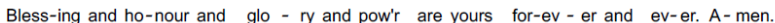
After supper he took the cup,

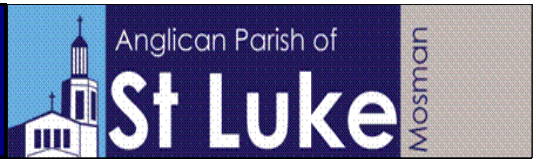
