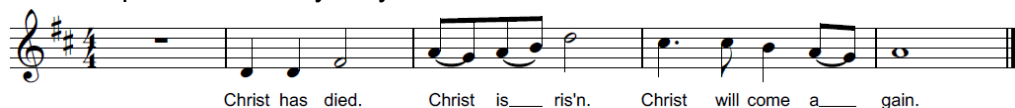

✠Do this in remembrance of me.'

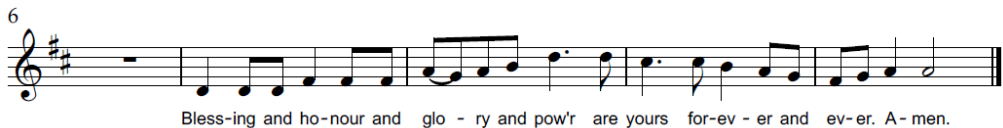
After supper he took the cup,
