Invitation to Confession and Absolution



The First Reading A reading from the Book of Exodus

The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them." Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. The Second Reading A Reading from the Second Epistle of Peter

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." The Sermon - The Reverend Philip Bradford

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Priest: The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

All: And also with you.

Priest: Baptism is the gift of our Lord Jesus Christ. When he had risen from the dead, he commanded his followers to go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

We have come together today to obey that command.

Baptism with water signifies the cleansing from sin that Jesus' death makes possible, and the new life God gives us through the Holy Spirit. In baptism, the promises of God are visibly signed and sealed for us. We are joined to Christ, and made members of his body, the Church universal.

Children are baptised in response to God's all-embracing love. Parents and Godparents who have responded to that love come now to bring them for baptism.

Before this congregation they must express their own trust and commitment to the promises of God, and their intention to bring up this child in the faith and practice of the Church. In due time he should make his own response to God, and be prepared for confirmation.

THE EXPLANATION OF THE BAPTISMAL SYMBOLS AND PRESENTATION

- *Priest:* I invite the Parents and Godparents to present the candidate for baptism:
- Parents & Godparents: We present Liam Brewster Lalor for baptism.
- *Priest:* Will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing him for baptism?
- Parents & Godparents: We will.
- *Priest:* Are you willing to answer on his behalf?
- Parents & Godparents: We are.

Priest: Before God and this congregation you must affirm that you turn to Christ and reject all that is evil. Therefore I ask: do you turn to Christ?

Parents and Godparents: I turn to Christ.

Priest: Do you repent of your sins?

Parents and Godparents: I repent of my sins.

Priest: Do you renounce Satan and all evil?

Parents and Godparents: I renounce all that is evil.

Priest: Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**

Will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

Parents and Godparents: We will.

Priest: You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

Congregation:

We will.

THE BLESSING OF THE WATER

- *Priest:* The Lord be with you.
- All: And also with you.
- *Priest:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- *Priest:* And now we give you thanks that you have called Liam Brewster Lalor to new birth in your church from the womb of this font through the waters of baptism. Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that being baptised in it, he may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection. May he die to sin, rise to newness of life and continue forever in Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we give you praise and honour, in the unity of the Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

Addressing the Parents and Godparents with the whole congregation, the priest says:

I now ask you to affirm as yours the faith of the Church.

- Priest:Do you believe in God the Father?All:I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.
- Priest:Do you believe in God the Son?All:I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died and was buried;
he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose from the dead;
he ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father;
from there he will come to judge
the living and the dead.
- Priest:Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?All:I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church
the communion of saints
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.

THE BAPTISM AND ANOINTING

Pouring water over the candidate the priest says:

Liam Brewster, I baptise you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

With fragrant oil which represents the permeating, enlightening and strengthening power of the Holy Spirit given to the baptised the priest says:

Liam, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own for ever.

All: Live as a disciple of Christ: fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith. Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming again. Presenting Liam with a lighted candle, the Priest says:

Liam, God has brought you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

All: Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

- *Priest:* God has called you into his Church.
- All: We therefore receive and welcome you as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God. Amen.

Prayers for the family and Godparents of Liam now follow :

Priest: Heavenly Father, we pray for the home of Liam, whom we have baptised in your Name. Give always to his parents, Alice and Matt, the spirit of wisdom and love. May their home share always in the joy of your eternal kingdom. Amen.

God of truth and love, we pray for Liam's Godparents. Enable them to share with their Godchild, what you have revealed to us in your holy Gospel. We ask this in the name of our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.


